## YEAR IN REVIEW

As winter settles around us and a new year begins, we're taking a moment to reflect on our past year and the great work that has happened in our agency. 2024 was a busy and inspiring year, full of growth, new faces, and transformative work, and we're excited to share these significant moments with you. Last year alone Artemis Center answered 6,711 hotline calls, met with 176 walk-in individuals, assisted with filing 109 Civil Protection Orders (CPOs), and served 1,397 clients.

Our 2024 Building Hope Holiday Program was nothing short of magical. With the help of our generous community, we brought joy, comfort, and a sense of normalcy to survivors and their families during the holiday season. This year's program was a shining example of how collective kindness can light the way for those on their journey to healing. Thank you to everyone who made this program a resounding success; your support truly made the season brighter for so many.

October was an especially powerful month as we observed Domestic Violence Awareness Month. From impactful events like our Breaking the Cycle' Fundraising Breakfast, to new community partnerships, we were able to raise over \$107,000 to sustain our vital work—another incredible testament to the power of our community.

Launched in September 2024, our Rapid Housing Program is an exciting new resource aimed at providing stable, safe housing solutions for clients in our care.
